OpenTTD is a remake of the classic 1995 Chris Sawyer game Transport Tycoon deluxe. The first versions of this open-sourced remake were made in 2004, though the game continues to get updates to this day.

GAMEPLAY

Like you probably expected, in this game you transport people and freight between cities, towns and industries. You transport things and people via trains, planes, buses, trucks, ships, helicopters, streetcars and other means of transportation.

You play on procedurally-generated maps that go up to 4096x4098 tiles. These maps are very well generated and customisable. You can alter the generation itself and the amount of cities, towns and industries that appear on the map. This offer a lot of customization. If that is not enough for you, you can also download community made maps, challanges, new vehicles and more.

The game is also multiplayer friendly and hosts a wide variety of servers that you can play on. If you do not wish to play online, but still want some competition, you can enable enemy AIs in the settings. The AI is not great, but there are many community patches that fix/add-on to them.

GRAPHICS AND SOUND
